






Crime Statistics: Sector 2





















ANTI-POACHING INITIATIVE

- 1. MEETING WAS HELD ON 29 OCTOBER 2019
 - SAPS (Brig. Heilbron and delegation of 4 SAPS Officers/WO)
 - Representatives from PBSW
 - Representatives from PBRA
 - Representatives from Community Police Forum
 - Representatives from Hangklip Conservancy
 - Representatives from Security Companies
 - Politicians and Reporters
- 2. OPERATION PHAKISA IN CONJUNCTION WITH OPERATION CARONA COMMENCED TOWARDS THE END OF SEPTEMBER 2019 AND IS ONGOING
- 3. SEVERAL SUCCESSFUL OPERATIONS:
 - Searches on vehicles done, Prevention of poaching, Vehicle Check Points (Road Blocks), Vehicles impounded, Vehicles suspended, Vessels seized, Trailers impounded, Diving gear and equipment, Fines, Cases opened, Arrests, Foreigners without papers, Abalone shipments seized.
- 4. SIGNIFICANT DECLINE IN POACHING ACTIVITIES SINCE THE COMMENCEMENT OF PHAKISA.
- 5. REPORT POACHING ACTIVITIES TO: SAPS 082 302 8863





PAINTING THE CRIME PICTURE

- HISTORICAL DATA GIVES SOME INSIGHT IN HOW CRIME ACTIVITIES HAPPENED IN THE PAST AND IT ALSO TRANSLATES INTO INFORMATION WE USE TO DETERMINE POTENTIAL SHIFTS IN CRIME TENDENCIES IN PREPARATION OF BEING PRO-ACTIVE INSTEAD OF BEING RE-ACTIVE WITHIN THE CRIME ENVIRONMENT
- WE HAVE INTERNAL THREATS WITHIN THE VILLAGE AND WE HAVE EXTERNAL THREATS COMING FROM OUTSIDE THE VILLAGE
- WE HAVE FACTORS WE CAN CONTROL AND THERE ARE FACTORS WE HAVE NO CONTROL OVER
- SUCCESSFUL CRIME PREVENTION IN ONE GEOGRAPHICAL AREA INEVITABLY LEADS TO A SHIFT IN CRIME TO NEIGHBOURING GEOGRAPHICAL AREAS
- OMBUDSMAN's REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION
- COMPLETELY ERADICATING CRIME CALLS FOR RADICAL MEASURES OUR SOCIAL FABRIC DOES NOT
 ALLOW US TO IMPLEMENT RADICAL MEASURES ... THE CRIMINAL SEEMS TO HAVE MORE HUMAN RIGHTS
 THAN THE NORMAL CITIZEN ... WE THUS WILL HAVE TO DEAL WITH THE FACT THAT THERE WILL ALWAYS
 BE CRIME OF SOME SORT ...

THE IMPORTANT THING IS THUS HOW WE ARE PREPARED TO DEAL WITH THAT CRIME

4. OUR PHILOSOPHY:

PREVENTION BE PRO-ACTIVE RATHER THAN REACTIVE

WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF:

- * MINIMIZING THE IMPACT ON OUR NATURAL ENVIRONMENT
- * NOT IMPOSING ON THE PRIVACY OF OUR RESIDENTS
- * BE IN SUPPORT OF THE BIGGER PICTURE (Cluster ICC and ICS)


- a) HALF OF PRINGLE BAY VILLAGE HAS A NATURAL FENCE ... THE OCEAN






5. OUR APPROACH
